About me:

I'm a young-at-heart forty-something with a vivid creativity. Over the years, I've tried many different activities, until I finally discovered the magical world of crochet and amigurumi — where I believe I've found my ultimate "happy place."

The pattern:

This pattern is also designed to be printed double-sided. The side margins allow you to punch the paper manually, so you can store it together with other patterns — just like we used to do at school.

The idea is to gradually create an organized collection with this pattern and future ones I'll make, but you can also integrate it with other printable patterns you may already have.

I hope you like the idea! Once your project is finished, I'd love to see your feedback.

Ingredients:

For this project I used:

- Size 10 crochet hook
- Cloudy yarn by Stafil
- stuffing
- yarn needle
- scissors
- stitch markers

Abbreviations and reading info:

ch: chain

mr: magic ring

sl st: slip stitch

sc: single crochet

inc: increase

dec: decrease

Working in the back loop only means making single crochet stitches of that round by inserting the hook only into the back loop of the stitch from the previous row.

The number in parentheses at the end of each round, e.g., (18), is the total number of stitches you should have at the end of that round.

You can make the same amigurumi smaller by following the same pattern but using a smaller hook and thinner yarn.

Notes:

- Work tight stitches.
- Read the entire pattern before starting to get an overall idea of the project.
- Use a stitch marker to mark each round, which will be worked in a spiral.
- without ever closing with a slip stitch.

Reselling or modifying this pattern in any part is strictly prohibited.

The project: Whale

Body: start with the color of the body

Round 1: 6 sc in mr (6)

Round 2: 6 inc (12)

Round 3: (1 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (18)

Round 4: (2 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (24)

Round 5: (3 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (30)

Round 6: (4 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (36)

Round 7: (5 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (42)

Round 8: (6 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (48)

Round 9-16: 48 sc (48)

*Change color to white

Round 17: 48 sc (48)

Round 18: (6 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times IN THE BACK LOOP (42)

Round 19: (5 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times (36)

Round 20: (4 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times (30)

*Insert the eyes on both sides, just above the first round with white yarn.

Round 21: (3 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times (24)

Round 22: (2 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times (18)

Round 23: (1 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times (12)

*Close the work and fasten off.

Fins x2:

Round 1: 6 sc in am (6)

Round 2: (1 sc + 1 inc) x 3 times (9)

Round 3: 9 sc (9)

Round 4: (1 sc + 1 dec) x 3 times (6)

Caudal fin:

Round 1: 6 sc in am (6)

Round 2: 6 inc (12)

Round 3: 12 sc (12)

*Make two identical pieces from rounds 1 to 3. For the first piece, fasten off the yarn. Do not cut the yarn of the second piece, as we will continue working from it.

*Unite both pieces with 1 sl st.

Round 4: 24 sc (24)

Round 5: (2 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times (18)

Round 6: (1 sc + 1 dec) x 6 times (12)

Sew the 3 fins to the body and embroider the cheeks with pink Cloudy yarn.



The project: Starfish

Body: start with the first color chosen

Round 1: 6 sc in am (6)

Round 2: 6 inc (12)

Round 3: (1 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (18)

Round 4: (2 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (24)

Round 5: (3 sc + 1 inc) x 6 times (30)

*Now, crochet all the points, working continuously into the base circle.



Tips x 5:

Row 1: 6 sc + 1 ch to turn (6)

Row 2: 5 sc starting from the second stitch (skip the first one). + 1 ch to turn (5)

Row 3: 4 sc starting from the second stitch (skip the first one). + 1 ch to turn (4)

Row 4: 3 sc starting from the second stitch (skip the first one). + 1 ch to turn (3)

Row 5: 2 sc starting from the second stitch (skip the first one). + 1 ch to turn (2)

*If we haven't made any mistakes, the front of the circle should be facing us. Now we'll work down the left side of the point to the last of the 6 sc from the first row, making about 5 sc.

*Start the second point from the first free stitch.

*After creating the 5 points, cut the yarn and fasten off.

Make a second star, identical in shape, using the same color or a different one. Insert the safety eyes on the side where you want to create the face, or on both sides to have two different faces. Then start sewing the two pieces together, stuffing as you go before finishing the seam.
